Gary Alan Smith

Gary is Senior Editor of Music Resources at Abingdon Press. He served as editorial manager of The United Methodist Hymnal project, and managing editor of The Faith We Sing. He has served churches in music ministries over the past 35 years, and is currently Director of Music Ministries at Donelson Heights UMC in Nashville, TN. Gary was named Project Director and Co-Editor of the now abandoned Hymnal Revision Project, and is currently Project Director for the forthcoming hymn supplement *Worship & Song*.



Ginger G. Wyrick

Ginger makes her home in Charlotte, NC. She is in demand as an author, conductor, clinician, lecturer, teacher, and performer. She continues to serve the local church as a director and organist, and frequently leads development events for congregations, staff, and choirs. Dean B. McIntyre

FOUR WORKSHOP "Tracks"

Subject to adjustment

While any participant may attend any workshop, like-minded people can attend consecutive workshops designed primarily for them.

The **SINGERS** track is primarily for choir members who wish to develop or refresh their vocal techniques, sing the worship anthems more confidently, and gain deeper understanding of technical rhythmic terms directors throw around.

The **DIRECTORS** track will help directors re-arrange anthems to make them "fit" the personnel in their specific choir, as well as give an opportunity to "chat" about concerns common to directors and share ideas and solutions.

The **OTHER CHURCH MUSICIANS** track offers a workshop on hymn improvisation for keyboard players, and another for beginning Handbell directors and players.

The **MISCELLANEOUS** track will interest singers and non-singers alike. It includes a crafts class on creating homemade greeting cards that represent your personal faith journey.

INTERMEDIATE AND ADVANCED HANDBELL

RINGERS: There will be 13-14 spots available to prepare Sunday's offertory. Sing-ups will be on Friday night. Please note: The weekend is primarily choral in emphasis. Only two hours of rehearsal is specifically for these 13-14 Handbell ringers.
