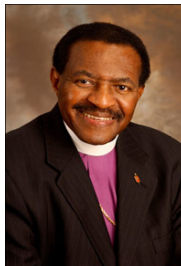
June 21 Rev. Dr. Mary John Dye, *WNC UMW Sponsor Partner*
Mary John began her ministry as the first cross-racial appointment in the Mississippi Conference (serving Rasberry United Methodist Church in the black community of Indianola, Mississippi. Indianola was in the spotlight of the nation as civil rights leader Fannie Lou Hamer went to the courthouse there to register to vote.) Mary John is presently serving the Western North Carolina Annual Conference as Superintendent of the Statesville District. Her term as superintendent follows 26 years as a pastor in churches of all sizes and settings.



June 28 Tom White-Wolf Fassett *SEJANAM Sponsor Partner*
Dr. Fassett, an internationally recognized champion of human and civil rights and an outspoken defender of Native and indigenous rights, has traveled throughout the world assisting those whose voices are not heard-to Zimbabwe and Mozambique; Guatemala to Denmark. Dr. Fassett is the founding Minister of Urban Mission in Rochester, N.Y and continues to work in the field of faith, public policy and social justice. He is a clergy member of the North Central New York Annual Conference, and author of *Giving Our Hearts Away - Native American Survival*, the 2008 - Women's Division Mission Study.



July 5 Rhonda Van Dyke-Colby
The Rev. Dr. Rhonda VanDyke Colby is the Dean of Spiritual Life and Co-director of The Institute for Church Professions (ICP) at Shenandoah University, Winchester, VA. She joined The Shenandoah University family in February 2006 when The Institute for Church Professions was created. The mission of the Institute is the *calling, forming, and sending of leaders for tomorrow's church and world.*



July 12 Bishop Woodie W. White
Bishop White recently retired from the Indiana Conference, United Methodist Church. From 1969-1984 he was General Secretary of the General Commission on Religion and Race of the United Methodist Church. Elected a Bishop in 1984, he served the Illinois Great Rivers Area prior to coming to Indiana. He was president of the General Board of Discipleship from 1988-1992 and president of the Council of Bishops in 1996-1997.



July 19 Keith Tonkel *Foundation For Evangelism Sponsor Partner*
Dr. Tonkel has a remarkable record of ministry, leadership and service within The United Methodist Church. Dr. Tonkel is a gifted preacher who averages twelve to eighteen three-day revivals a year, in Mississippi and beyond. July 26 Gayle Felton
Rev. Felton is an elder in the North Carolina Annual Conference. She holds a Master of Divinity degree from Duke Divinity School (1982), and a Ph.D., with concentration in the history of Christianity, also Duke University (1987). She has served on the faculties of Meredith College and Duke Divinity School. She is the author of two official United Methodist texts on the Sacraments - Baptism and Holy Communion.



August 2 Dr. Thomas Long *Ward Endowment*
Rev. Tom Long is the Bandy Professor of Preaching at Candler School of Theology, Emory University, Atlanta, GA, and the author or editor of 14 books on preaching and worship. He is ordained in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Professor Long's research interests are homiletically theory and biblical hermeneutics and preaching. His current research project is centered in the theology and practice of Christian funerals.

Dr. Mallett is both an ordained Methodist minister in Great Britain and a physician. He has preached extensively in Britain and in the US; for the past 35 years he has been a speaker at many gatherings at Lake Junaluska Assembly.
