# Special Guest Speakers



**Bishop Al Gwinn** was elected a Bishop, July 2004. He is the Resident Bishop for the North Carolina Annual Conference. He has pastored rural, town, inner city, and urban congregations, as well as an African-American congregation. His last appointment was as Senior Pastor of Lexington First Church (mother of Kentucky Methodism). Bishop Gwinn received a M.Div. from Asbury Theological Seminary. Bishop Gwinn also has an Honorary Doctor of Divinity from Union College.



**Dr. Negiel Bigpond**, Yuchi, is founder and President of Two Rivers Native American Training Center. Dr. Bigpond is a fourth generation minister of the gospel and has been in ministry for over thirty years. As both an evangelist and pastor, Dr. Bigpond has preached on over 143 Native Reservations. He is involved with Native American Justice Gate East of the Mississippi, which deals with land reconciliation in the eastern states.



**Rev. Dr. Michael Cummings**, Lumbee, holds a Master of Divinity from Southeastern Seminary and was awarded a honorary Doctor of Divinity from Campbell University in 2000. In 1987 Rev. Cummings became the executive director of the Burnt Swamp Baptist Association. He currently serves as a board member of the Presidential Advisors and Board of Trustees at Campbell University.

**Chief Stephen R. Adkins**, Chickahominy, is a graduate of Bacone Jr. College, Muskogee, Oklahoma, where he received his Associate Arts Degree; and Virginia Commonwealth University, where he received his B.S. He is the Chief of the Chickahominy Indian Tribe and a member of the Advisory Committee for a National Geographic Native American Documentary.



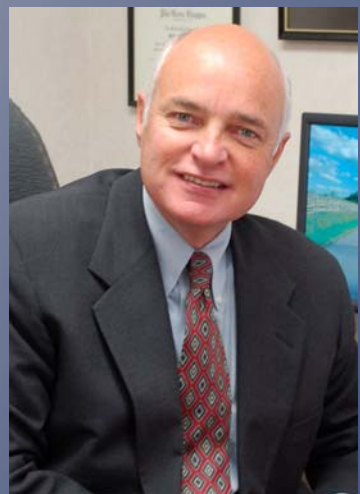
**Rev. Dr. Milford Oxendine**, Lumbee, recently earned a Doctorate of Ministry from Hood Theological Seminary and holds a M.Div. degree from Duke University. He was the first Lumbee Indian to complete a Masters at Duke. Rev. Oxendine was ordained an Elder in 1980.



**Roland Stanley**, ALABAMA CHOCTAW, is a member of the Choctaw from Alabama. He attends Aldersgate U.M.C. Roland has served as Sunday School Superintendent, Board of Trustees, Financial Chairman, and Church Council Chairman. Roland also is a strong advocate for Native Americans at all levels, locally, nationally and internationally.



**Rev. Dr. Jim McClendon**, has served as Columbia District Superintendent; Cabinet Representative to the SC Committee on Native American Ministries; SC Conference Parliamentarian; Native American forum; and Connectional Table. He teaches “UM Discipline and Polity” at Candler School of Theology.



# Workshop Speakers

**Rev. Dr. Kenneth Locklear**, Lumbee, holds the position of Senior Pastor at Prospect UMC in the Rockingham District of the N.C. Annual Conference. He was previously employed as Executive Director of SEJANAM. Dr. Locklear's experience in service and ministry is vast. He started a new church ministry at Triad Native American UMC in the Western N.C. Conference .



**Chief Kenneth Adams**, Upper Mattaponi, is a historian and advocate for Native Americans. Chief Adams is actively involved with congress to recognize Virginia Indians, addressing survival, culture and laws and policies. Some of his works include "400 years of the church and Indian relationship, Native American Spirituality, and Virginia Indians and the Jamestown 2007 Experience.



**Rev. Dr. David Hill**, Lumbee, a spiritual elder and activist, Pastor Hill has been heavily involved in American Indian issues of poverty, justice and religious freedom. He has served as campus pastor at the Ohio State University from 1997 to 2004. Pastor Hill is currently serving as pastor at Living Savior Lutheran Church in Charlotte, NC.

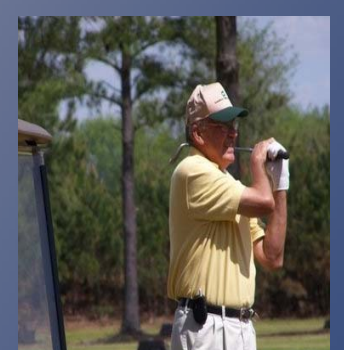
